Coordination to comply with these other laws may require FHWA involvement. Furthermore, designation of this project as a (c)-listed CE does not relieve the requirement for WisDOT to coordinate with WDNR under the Cooperative Agreement. Rivers, Streams and Floodplains	The Fox River and the Wind Lake Drainage canal are navigable waterways. In order to protect developing fish eggs and substrate for aquatic organisms, all instream work that could adversely impact water quality should be avoided between March 1st and June 15th of the calendar year. Submit Waterway Marker Application and Permit so the Fox River can be posted for recreational traffic. Invasive Species and Viral Hemorrhagic Septicemia (VHS): Adequate precautions will be taken to prevent transporting or introducing invasive species via construction equipment, as provided under chapter NR 40 Wis. Adm. Code. Further information on species classified as Restricted or Prohibited under NR 40 can be found at: http://dnr.wi.gov/topic/invasives/documents/nr40lists.pdf . Any equipment coming into contact with surface waters will be properly cleaned and disinfected to address the spread on invasive species and viruses. Special provisions will require contractors in implement the following measures before and after mobilizing in-water equipment to prevent the spread of VHS, Zebra mussel, and other invasive species. Contractors should follow STSP 107-055 Environmental Protection, Aquatic Exotic Species Control, or protocol found here: https://dnr.wi.gov/topic/Fishing/vhs/vhs_qahowyoucanhelp.html Structure Removal: Due to the characteristics of this section of the Fox River and Wind Lake Drainage Canal, STSP 203-020, Removing Old Structure Over Waterway With Minimal Debris, will be adequate for this project. WisDOT will meet the standards of chapter NR116, Wis. Adm. Code, Floodplain Management, for the causeway. The causeway will be clearly marked and lit for navigational safety of any recreationist who may use the river at night, and a waterway marker permit maybe required.

Threatened and Endangered Species	River Redhorse, Moxostoma carinatum, is present in the Fox River at both bridge locations. Impacts to this species can be avoided by following the in-water restrictive time periods, including no in-water work between March 1st and June 1st of the calendar year.
Air Quality	No commitments needed.
Construction Stage Sound Quality	WisDOT Standard Specification 107.8(6) and 108.7.1 will apply.
Traffic Noise	No commitments needed.

Hazardous Substances or Contamination	The department and others completed testing for soil and groundwater contamination for locations within this project where excavation is required. Testing indicated that soil contaminated with petroleum volatile organic compounds (PVOCs) is present at the following locations where excavation is required, as shown on the plans: 1. STH 36 from STA 390+50 to 391+50, from reference line to project limits right, from 4' to 16' bgs. Soil contains PVOCs and must be managed. Approximately 80 cubic yards (approximately 136 tons at an estimated 1.7 tons per cubic yard) of soil will be excavated from this location. 2. North side of East Main Street, east of STH 36, from STH 36 STA 389+15 to 389+40, from 200' right of STH 36 reference line to 300' right of STH 36 reference line, from 1' bgs to 4' bgs. Soil contains PVOCs and must be managed. Approximately 60 cubic yards (approximately 102 tons at an estimated 1.7 tons per cubic yard) of soil will be excavated from this location. Directly load soil excavated by the project at the above location into trucks that will transport the soil to a WDNR-licensed landfill facility for disposal. Removed sediment materials from culverts will be disposed within project limits and in WisDOT's ROW.		
Storm Water	Project will comply with Trans 401 and stormwater permitting requirements.		
Erosion Control	Erosion control devices will be specified on the contract plans and an ECIP will be developed by the contractor 14 days prior to the preconstruction meeting in accordance with WisDOT standard processes.
