Jeff,

The Village is willing to meet with WisDOT if it materially affects the preferred alternative prior to its filing with FHWA. It remains unclear to me if all of our concerns are addressed in the plan to be presented or not, and with the very limited interaction between us again its hard to be able to see that.

I appreciate your description of the process and the phone call from Brandon, but the truth of the matter is that <u>the preferred alternative being advanced at the end of this month was prepared with little to no input from the</u> <u>Village</u>. Brandon stated that we'll connect more in the design process, but the plan is in place by that point and decisions made without our involvement. Again, using items such as the plan for the Farwell intersection as an example, a layout for this intersection is being included in the EA without our input or consideration of other options. We cannot agree to this layout and the changes associated with it as it creates major traffic issues for all involved. As such this layout gets locked in to the process and deviating from this later becomes impossible. That has been my experience with how WisDOT and FHWA administers an EA after it receives its FONSI. We will remain in opposition until it can be demonstrated that the plan will adequately address the issues we have raised.

If this cannot be done we'll likely need to request the Public Hearing when it comes out, engage the Community and local stakeholders in providing additional feedback as well as further contact Central Office and our Representatives to properly address the points we've raised with this plan.

We could be made available as early as next week. Let us know what dates work for you.

Good morning Matt,

WisDOT anticipates the US 51 Stoughton to McFarland Environmental Assessment (EA) will be signed by the Federal Highway Administration (FHWA) in late November or early December 2020. Once the EA is signed by FHWA, there will be an approximate 30-day availability period for stakeholders to review and submit comments on the document.

During the EA document availability period, WisDOT will offer the opportunity to request a public hearing. A public hearing is a more formal event than a public involvement meeting that provides agencies and the public full opportunity to express opinions about the proposed project. If a public hearing is requested, it is anticipated to be held in February 2021, and the document availability period will be extended until that time. WisDOT will accept comment during the duration of the document availability period.

After the document availability period has ended, WisDOT will review all comments received and address any issues or concerns that are submitted. WisDOT will then work towards completing an addendum to the EA, which FHWA will review to determine whether the preferred alternative has a significant impact to the environment. If FHWA determines that the project does not have a significant impact to the environment, a Finding of No Significant Impact (FONSI) will be issued. At that point, the study will be completed, and the project can move forward into the final design process. If FHWA considers the impacts significant, further study in the form of an Environmental Impact Statement (EIS) would be required. Based on analysis and public and agency comments to-date, WisDOT anticipates that FHWA will sign the FONSI in Spring 2021.

As we have previously discussed, items the village of McFarland has identified concerns about will continue to be evaluated and refined as part of the final design process. During the final design process, WisDOT will continue to meet the Village to address comments and issues.

Please provide dates Village staff would be available to meet, and the region will work to schedule a virtual meeting with village representatives to further discuss concerns and the anticipated EA and final design schedule.

WisDOT looks forward to continuing working with the Village on this project.
