The Wisconsin Department of Natural Resources received your Water Resources Application for Project Permits or Notice of Intent, on June 29, 2015, for the Prairie du Sac Pedestrian Improvements site and has evaluated the information provided regarding storm water discharges from your construction site. We have determined that your construction site activities will be regulated under ch. 283, Wis. Stats., ch. NR 216, Wis, Adm. Code, and in accordance with Wisconsin Pollutant Discharge Elimination System (WPDES) General Permit No. WI-S067831-04, Construction Site Storm Water Runoff. All erosion control and storm water management activities undertaken at the site must be done in accordance with the terms and conditions of the general permit.

The Start Date of permit coverage for this site is July 07, 2015. The maximum period of permit coverage for this site is limited to 3 years from the Start Date. Therefore, permit coverage automatically expires and terminates 3 years from the Start Date and storm water discharges are no longer authorized unless another Notice of Intent and application fee to retain coverage under this permit or a reissued version of this permit is submitted to the Department 14 working days prior to expiration.

4. When construction activities have ceased and the site has undergone final stabilization, a Notice of Termination (NOT) of coverage under the general permit must be submitted to the Department.

It is important that you read and understand the terms and conditions of the general permit because they have the force of law and apply to you. Your project may lose its permit coverage if you do not comply with its terms and conditions. The Department may also withdraw your project from coverage under the general permit and require that you obtain an individual WPDES permit instead, based on the Department's own motion, upon the filing of a written petition by any person, or upon your request.

We are requesting concurrence from the U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service that the proposed Village of Prairie du Sac, Pedestrian Improvements project is *not likely to adversely affect* the Northern Long-eared Bat (Myotis septentrionalis). The proposed project is located in the Village of Prairie du Sac, Sauk County, Wisconsin. This is a Safe Routes to School Project sponsored by the Village of Prairie du Sac in conjunction with WisDOT that will be locally let.

The proposed project involves construction of a multi-use path on 13th Street/Sycamore Street from Hemlock Street to Grand Avenue, a multi-use path on Hemlock Street from Maple Street to 13th Street/Sycamore Street, crossing beacon signs and curb ramp replacement at the intersection of Prairie Street/CTH PF and 9th Street, and crossing beacon signs at the intersection of Grand Avenue and 9th Street. The project is anticipated to be constructed in the summer of 2016.

One tree (approximately 6" diameter) is located on the alignment of the proposed multi-use path. This tree will be relocated approximately 10 feet from its existing location. The tree will be moved using a treetransplanting machine that is capable of digging and removing from the ground an unbroken mass of earth of the specified size and shape. It shall also lift and transport the mass of earth supporting the specified size plant and containing its roots in an undisturbed condition. The machine shall hold the soil mass and roots in the undisturbed condition until the tree is lowered into position in a planting hole pre-dug by the same machine. During the tree relocation process, periodic noise and exhaust is expected. All activities will occur during daylight hours. Tree relocation should not require more than one working day.

We carefully reviewed (on February 17, 2016) your agency's Section 7 Consultation website for a list of species and critical habitat that "may be present" within the project area. There are a total of six threatened or endangered species that may be present: Whooping crane (*Grus americana*), higgins eye (*Lampsilis higginsil*), Sheepnose Mussel (*Plethobasus cyphyus*), Northern Wild monkshood (*Aconitum noveboracense*), Prairie bush-clover (*Lespedeza leptostachya*), and Northern long-eared Bat (*Myotis septentrionalis*).

For all the species listed above, except for the Northern long-eared Bat (Myotis septentrionalis), no suitable habitats lie within the range of the project.

Because this project does not involve any habitat (tree) removal, but rather the relocation of one tree; the fact that the transplant will occur in one day, during daylight hours; and that all applicable AMMs regarding tree

removal will be implemented, we anticipate only insignificant, or discountable effects to occur to the Northern long-eared Bat (*Myotis septentrionalis*).

For these reasons, we conclude that the Village of Prairie du Sac, Pedestrian Improvements Project is not likely to adversely affect the Northern Long-eared Bat (*Myotis septentrionalis*). We request your concurrence with our determination(s).

The Wisconsin Department of Natural Resources received your Water Resources Application for Project Permits or Notice of Intent, on June 29, 2015, for the Prairie du Sac Pedestrian Improvements site and has evaluated the information provided regarding storm water discharges from your construction site. We have determined that your construction site activities will be regulated under ch. 283, Wis. Stats., ch. NR 216, Wis. Adm. Code, and in accordance with Wisconsin Pollutant Discharge Elimination System (WPDES) General Permit No. WI-S067831-04, Construction Site Storm Water Runoff. All erosion control and storm water management activities undertaken at the site must be done in accordance with the terms and conditions of the general permit.

The Start Date of permit coverage for this site is July 07, 2015. The maximum period of permit coverage for this site is limited to 3 years from the Start Date. Therefore, permit coverage automatically expires and terminates 3 years from the Start Date and storm water discharges are no longer authorized unless another Notice of Intent and application fee to retain coverage under this permit or a reissued version of this permit is submitted to the Department 14 working days prior to expiration.

To ensure compliance with the general permit, please read it carefully and be sure you understand its contents. Please take special note of the following requirements (This is not a complete list of the terms and conditions of the general permit.):

1. The Construction Site Erosion Control Plan and Storm Water Management Plan that you completed prior to submitting your permit application must be implemented and maintained throughout construction. Failure to do so may result in enforcement action by the Department.



2. The general permit requires that erosion and sediment controls be routinely inspected at least every 7 days, and within 24 hours after a rainfall event of 0.5 inches or greater. Weekly written reports of all inspections must be maintained. The reports must contain the following information:

- a. Date, time, and exact place of inspection;
- b. Name(s) of individual(s) performing inspection;
- c. An assessment of the condition of erosion and sediment controls;
- d. A description of any erosion and sediment control implementation and maintenance performed;
- e. A description of the site's present phase of construction.

3. A Certificate of Permit Coverage must be posted in a conspicuous place on the construction site. The Certificate of Permit Coverage (WDNR Publication # WT-813) is enclosed for your use.

4. When construction activities have ceased and the site has undergone final stabilization, a Notice of Termination (NOT) of coverage under the general permit must be submitted to the Department.

It is important that you read and understand the terms and conditions of the general permit because they have the force of law and apply to you. Your project may lose its permit coverage if you do not comply with its terms and conditions. The Department may also withdraw your project from coverage under the general permit and require that you obtain an individual WPDES permit instead, based on the Department's own motion, upon the filing of a written petition by any person, or upon your request.

If you believe that you have a right to challenge this decision to grant permit coverage, you should know that the Wisconsin statutes and administrative rules establish time periods within which requests to review Department decisions must be filed. For judicial review of a decision pursuant to ss. 227.52 and 227.53, Wis. Stats., you have 30 days after the decision is mailed, or otherwise served by the Department, to file your petition with the appropriate circuit court and serve the petition on the Department. Such a petition for judicial review must name the Department of Natural Resources as the respondent.

To request a contested case hearing pursuant to s. 227.42, Wis. Stats., you have 30 days after the decision is mailed, or otherwise served by the Department, to serve a petition for hearing on the Secretary of the Department of Natural Resources. All requests for contested case hearings must be made in accordance with s. NR 2.05(5), Wis. Adm. Code, and served on the Secretary in accordance with s. NR 2.03, Wis. Adm. Code. The filing of a request for a contested case hearing is not a prerequisite for judicial review and does not extend the 30-day period for filing a petition for judicial review.
